

## Bellingen Community Resilience Panel Come Together for the First Time

Bellingen Shire Council & Newcastle University have partnered to engage and empower community through a deliberative panel who came together for the first time on 13 November 2020. From 77 expressions of interest, 25 panel members were selected against specific criteria to represent of our Shire. Panelists spent one evening and one day together with expert speakers from Sustainable Landscapes, Cobargo Bushfire Recovery and the Food Connect Foundation.

The aim of the panel was to:

- understand the issues related to community resilience for the Shire and
- explore the role of Council, the community, and others in building capacity for community resilience.

2020 has been a long and challenging year for all of us – first there was the drought, then the fires and floods, and now the COVID-19 pandemic, and there's still plenty of hard work to be done to meet the future challenges we'll face in 2021.

But if we all work together as a Council and a community, and make the most of the opportunities we get, then we'll continue to achieve great things, just like we did this year despite some pretty challenging circumstances.

Just like how we strengthened our capacity to recover and better prepare for future disaster events, with members of our community securing Community Leadership & Resilience Scholarships to complete two leadership and resilience subjects with Charles Sturt University.

Thankfully, our local leaders will also be joined by the next generation of scholarship recipients in 2021, because Council has been working with the Mid North Coast Joint Organisation (MNCJO) and we've managed to secure a further \$75,000 to continue the program next year.

That means you need to keep an eye out in the new year to take advantage of the opportunity to become one of our Shire's local leaders and contribute towards our community's capacity to support a strong, positive recovery, and better prepare for future disaster events.

We've also managed to progress some signature projects in our Shire this year that will continue to deliver and attract thousands of day trippers to Dangar Falls via Coramba Road and provide a positive knock-on effect for local businesses in Dorrigo.

Once completed, the Dangar Falls Upgrade Project will see the old viewing platform upgraded so locals and visitors can take in one of the best views in our Shire as they stand on a curved platform which overhangs the cliff by an amazing three metres.

To deliver people to this natural beauty, Council has also invested \$250,000 and secured another \$1,290,000 in funding to replace Coramba Road's old single lane and load limited Deep Creek Bridge, which is also good news for the five dairies that use the bridge to transport 6 million litres of milk annually.

Finally, with detailed survey activities well under way, we're also set to begin delivering our Shire's \$22 million Coastal Communities Sewer Infrastructure Project in 2021, which will protect our tourism and aquiculture industries and the health of our Bellinger and Kalang Rivers.

So, it looks like 2021 is shaping up to be one of the busiest years on record for our Shire, so let's take advantage of the opportunity to take it easy this Festive Season, because we'll need to hit the ground running in the New Year.
