Students learn about the water cycle, where our water comes from, how to conserve water, and how to keep our rivers clean.

SCHOOL WATER AUDITS

As part of their Waterwise certificate, students conduct a school water audit, identifying leaks and saving water.

Pictured right is Orama Primary School, who identified two leaky taps and a 'dodgy flush button' saving approximately 10,512 litres of water a year – proving that even small actions can have a big impact.
