



Go Before You Go Campaign

The Bellingen Shire's "Go Before You Go" campaign urged both visitors and locals to protect the region's pristine waterways and swimming spots during the busy holiday season. With a focus on responsible planning, the campaign emphasised using public toilets before venturing beyond the township to preserve the environment and respect Indigenous land.

Through a multi-channel approach including local businesses flyer distribution, roadside advertising, print, radio, digital ads, and social media, the message was reinforced consistently.

Additionally, the campaign promoted leaving no trace, pet responsibility, sun safety, exploring responsibly and parking etiquette. With resources like a list of public toilets and targeted messaging, the campaign aimed to engage everyone in safeguarding the Shire's ecological treasures for future generations.

Lift The Lid on Mental Health



The Dorrigo Rotary Club, in collaboration with Council and Local Mental Health Organisations facilitated a community-wide Mental Health Walk from Dangar Falls, on Sunday 15 October 2023. This event aimed to raise awareness about mental health issues, reduce stigma, and foster a sense of togetherness in support of individuals carers and families affected by mental health challenges.

Organised by Rosi Klass, in collaboration with Council's Community Resilience Team and supported by various organisations, the event facilitated connections among residents, sharing local knowledge and addressing community needs.



At the Extraordinary Meeting of Council on 13 December, a resolution was passed to enter a contract with a preferred tender for the refurbishment of the Dorrigo Community Centre and Library Extension. This decision marks a significant step forward for the Dorrigo community and the broader Shire, allowing construction to commence in 2024.

PKN Constructions was awarded both projects following re-evaluation and negotiation, resulting in discounted costs while maintaining project scope. Funded by the NSW Government BLERF and State Library Funding, with a minor shortfall covered by Council reserves, the projects will enhance community facilities. Mayor Steve Allan expressed satisfaction with the negotiations, ensuring simultaneous completion with minimal adjustments. Though some initial elements won't be included, future revisions are possible without compromising the current projects' integrity. Construction is scheduled to

Snapshot

This summer, our social media channels featured updates on various initiatives, including improvements along Church St, progress on the CBD to Butter Factory Pathway and the Connell Park Footbridge, and the completion of Gleniffer Road and the retaining wall on Hillside Drive in Urunga. The Dorrigo Helipad is nearing completion, Martells Road underwent an upgrade, and Auslan Signs were introduced in parks for inclusivity. We also promoted local businesses during the festive season with Shop Local vouchers and highlighted products at artisan markets and the Bellingen Visitor Information Centre. A key focus was our "Go Before You Go" Campaign, encouraging responsible tourism and environmental stewardship, which received support through social media promotion.











The Council is currently experimenting with paid media strategies on social channels as part of targeted campaigns aimed at reaching specific audiences. Through geo-targeting capabilities, we can tailor campaigns specifically to the Shire, enhancing their reach and effectiveness. Our initial trials, which commenced in December, focused on two campaigns: one aimed at promoting awareness of the "Go before you Go" initiative, highlighting the importance of preserving natural sites and addressing the lack of public amenities; and the other promoting the first of the ShireSpeaks event, targeting Facebook and Instagram users in Urunga to increase awareness of event hosted in December.



The campaign highlights the need for visitors and locals to be conscientious when visiting our natural spaces as most do not have infrastructure and facilities. The campaign encourages people to use the bathroom before setting out, take rubbish with them, clean up after pets, select water safe sunscreens and generally be guardians of our natural areas. The campaign is running from mid-December 2023 to early Feb 2024.




